Captain Molly Wike currently serves as the Commanding Officer, Marine Safety Unit Port Arthur which includes the third busiest port, the third largest petrochemical complex and the busiest Strategic Port of Embarkation for Military Outload operations in the United States. 131 personnel serve at MSU Port Arthur performing marine inspections, marine casualty investigations, oil spill response, law enforcement, contingency planning, waterways management, vessel traffic management, administration, supply and medical functions.

Prior assignments include Deputy Sector Commander, Sector Ohio Valley, Prevention Department Head, Sector Ohio Valley; Contingency Planning Branch Chief, District Eight; Response Department Head, Marine Safety Unit Morgan City; Waterways Management Chief and Small Passenger Vessel Inspection Chief, Sector Mobile; Maritime Homeland Security Planning Team, Coast Guard Headquarters; Facility Inspector and Planning Officer, Marine Safety Office Jacksonville; and Port Operations Chief, Marine Safety Detachment Houma.
