Master Chief Perryman assumed his duties as the Command Master Chief for Air Station New Orleans in June 2016 with 20 years of Coast Guard service. As the senior enlisted member at Air Station New Orleans he advises the command on matters affecting the well-being, morale, and discipline of the command's enlisted personnel. In addition, he is the direct liaison with the other Military Services on board Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base New Orleans.

Master Chief Perryman has completed the Coast Guard Chiefs Academy, Coast Guard Senior Enlisted Leadership Course, numerous technical "C" schools. He has his FAA Airframe & Powerplant License and holds a Bachelor's of Science in Aeronautical Engineering Technology from Purdue University. His personal awards include the Coast Guard Commendation Medal and the Coast Guard Achievement Medal.
