



Command Master Chief Roy W. La Pointe



Master Chief Roy La Pointe assumed duties as Command Master Chief, Sector New Orleans on July 15, 2018. His primary responsibility is to advise the Commanding Officer of Sector New Orleans, on issues and initiatives pertaining to all Coast Guard members and their families within the Sector's Area of Responsibility. Sector New Orleans includes three stations, six cutters and all Louisiana waterways from the Mississippi/Louisiana State Line in the east, to Mile Marker 303 on the Lower Mississippi River in the north, to longitude 92-37W in the west. This area encompasses the 31 parishes in Southeastern Louisiana and includes some of the nation's busiest deep draft ports including the nation's only offshore deep draft port, the Louisiana Offshore Oil Port or LOOP. Most recently, Master Chief La Pointe served as the Command Master Chief for Sector Houston-Galveston, Texas.
