



## **Master Chief Lori J. Fields**

Master Chief Petty Officer Lori Fields assumed her duties as the Command Master Chief of Sector Northern New England on July 6, 2015. Her primary responsibility is to advise Captain Michael Baroody, the Commander of Sector Northern New England, on issues and initiatives pertaining to all Coast Guard members and their families in Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont.

Master Chief began her Coast Guard career in August of 1992. After basic training she was transferred to Group/Air Station Port Angeles in Washington State. Two years later she struck yeoman in the SPO/ADMIN shop. She advanced to YN3 in August of 1995 and received orders to the SPO in Honolulu, HI. On July 1<sup>st</sup>, 1998 she reported to Group Astoria and advanced to YN2 the same day and YN1 April of 2001. After Astoria she transferred to NESU Seattle in 2002 and then CAMSPAC in Point Reyes Station in 2006; as a YN1. After making YNC that winter she transferred to SECTOR Anchorage July of 2007. Master Chief quickly advanced to Senior Chief in April of 2009 and moved to ISC Seattle; where she stood up PSSU Seattle and then Base Seattle. In June of 2012 she advanced to Master Chief and served as the assistant to the Administration Officer until she was transferred to Training Center Petaluma as the YN "A" School Chief in 2013.



Master Chief Fields personal awards include three Coast Guard Commendation Medals, three Coast Guard Achievement Medals, two Coast Guard Commandant's Letter of Commendation Ribbons, and eight Coast Guard Good Conduct Medals.

Master Chief Fields is from Tonasket, WA and holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in General Studies. She is a graduate of Chief Petty Officer Academy Class 166, Coast Guard Senior Enlisted Leadership Course, Joint Forces Staff College Senior Enlisted Joint Professional Military Education Course Class 0710-A, and Navy Senior Enlisted Leadership Course Class 186.

She is married to SK1 Chuck Fields, USCG (ret) and they have one son, Spencer, who is 11.
