CDR Kauffman is currently assigned as the Deputy Sector Commander, Sector Detroit, Michigan. Sector Detroit and its eleven subordinate units are responsible for conducting and overseeing all Coast Guard missions in a complex area of responsibility with a continuous 427-mile international border with Canada through Lakes Erie, St. Clair and Huron and along the Detroit and St. Clair Rivers.
