

## **Commander Kevin D. Floyd, U.S. Coast Guard**



Commander Floyd is currently assigned as the Deputy Sector Commander, Sector Detroit, Michigan. Sector Detroit is responsible for conducting and overseeing all Coast Guard missions in a complex area of responsibility with a continuous 427-mile international border, resort islands, and one of world's busiest river corridors with over 4,000 annual vessel transits.

Commander Floyd has served in a variety of ashore and staff tours on both coasts, the Western Rivers, and on the Great Lakes. Commander Floyd enlisted in the Coast Guard in 1991 and spent seven years enlisted achieving the rank of Marine Science Technician First Class. His enlisted assignments included Group San Diego, the National Response Center at Coast Guard Headquarters in Washington, DC, and Marine Safety Office Memphis. Commander Floyd was commissioned in 1998 upon completing Officer Candidate School. After commissioning, he was assigned to Marine Safety Office Louisville as the Assistant Chief of the Investigations Department and Chief of the Ports and Waterways Management Department. His next assignment was at Marine Safety Office Charleston as the Chief of the Port Security and Operations Department. When Group and Marine Safety Office Charleston merged in 2005, he served as the Chief of the Logistics Department for the newly established Sector Charleston. He was then assigned to the Coast Guard 14<sup>th</sup> District in Honolulu where he served as the Supervisor of the District Response Advisory Team and later Chief of the District Command Center and Joint Rescue Coordination Center. Commander Floyd was Commanding Officer of Marine Safety Unit Toledo and then served as the Chief of the Facility Security Branch at Coast Guard Headquarters. Prior to his current assignment, he served as the Chief of the Prevention Department at Sector Detroit.

Commander Floyd has earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business and a Master of Arts degree in Management and Leadership. He has also participated in the Marine Environmental Protection Industry Training program. His awards and insignias include a Meritorious Service Medal, five Coast Guard Commendation Medals, two Coast Guard Achievement Medals, five Commandant's Letter of Commendations, Boat Forces Operations Insignia, Marine Safety Insignia, Command Ashore Device, and numerous unit and team awards.

Commander Floyd was born in Liberty, Kentucky and grew up as an "Army Brat" living in Kentucky, Alaska, Washington, Oklahoma, Alabama, and Germany. He and his wife Megan have two children, Ethan and Delaney.
