Commander Phil DeLisle reported to Air Station Borinquen as Operations Officer in 2022, managing 3 MH-60T helicopters/crews and dynamic SAR/LE operations in a vast Caribbean area of responsibility. Prior to assignment in Borinquen, CDR DeLisle was the CG-711 Aviation Rotary-Wing Capabilities Manager, responsible for developing strategies and requirements for all CG helicopter operations.

A native of Richmond, Virginia, CDR DeLisle graduated from Virginia Tech in 1997 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management. Upon graduation, CDR DeLisle was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army and proceeded to Fort Rucker, Alabama for Flight Training.

After graduating flight school as a CH-47D Chinook pilot, he was stationed at 2/52 Aviation

Regiment in the Republic of Korea and went on to serve seven years in the Army, holding multiple leadership positions including Maintenance Platoon Leader, Battalion Operations Officer, and Company Commanding Officer. Joining the Coast Guard as a Direct Commissioned Aviator in 2004, CDR DeLisle transitioned to the H-65 Dolphin to begin service as a Search and Rescue and Airborne Use of Force pilot.

CDR DeLisle has completed multiple aviation operations assignments and possesses over 5,000 flight hours in various Rotary-Wing aircraft. CDR DeLisle's Coast Guard tours include Air Station Miami, HITRON, Sector Corpus Christi, and Aviation Training Center (ATC) Mobile. His previous duties include Standardization Officer, Weapons Officer, Assistant Operations Officer, and Assistant Chief of the ATC H-65 Training Division.

CDR DeLisle's personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal (2), the Air Medal, the Coast Guard Commendation Medal (3), the Coast Guard Achievement Medal (3), and the Army Achievement Medal.

CDR DeLisle has been married for 23 years and has two sons.
